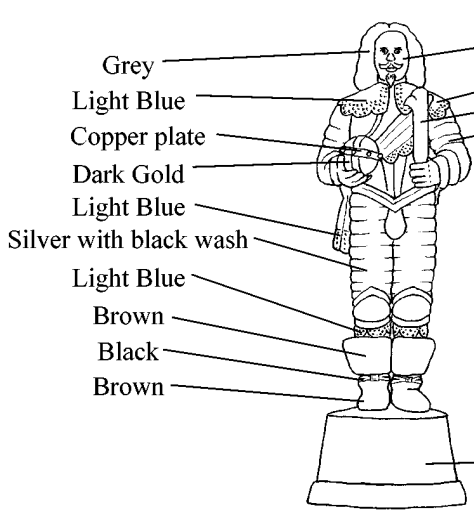


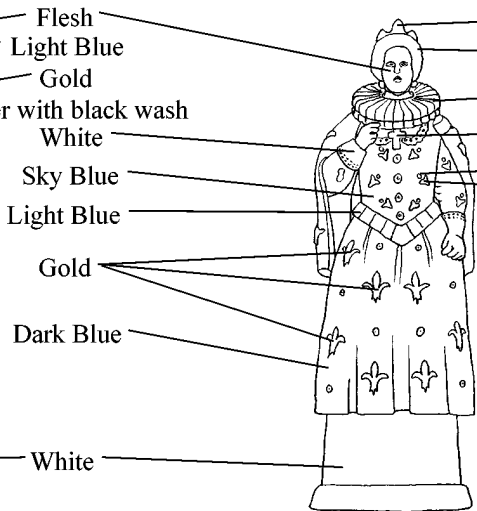
PRINCE AUGUST 717

- 1 In addition to filing off any flash from the figure, the bottom should be flattened where the ingate was removed.
- 2 Wash the figure in warm soapy water in preparation for painting.
- 3 Prime the pieces with a white undercoat then allow 24 hours to dry.
- 4 Always paint the lighter colours first as these are easily overpainted with a darker colour.

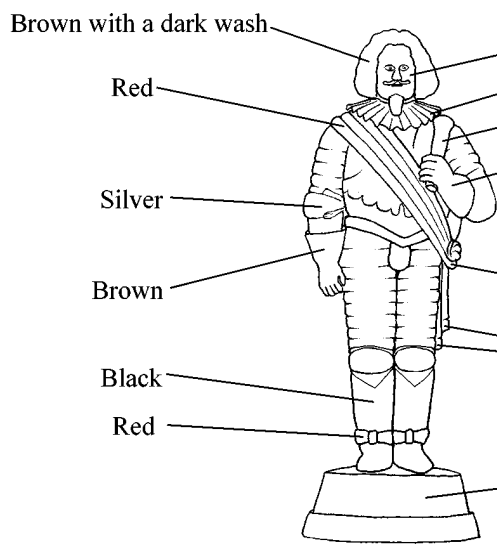
- 5 Paint as supplied is usually too thick. Thin with the appropriate thinners until it covers the areas touched by the brush but does not spread to other areas.
- 6 Shading or dry brushing will enhance detail on the figures giving better depth and animation.
- 7 We recommend that you give the figures a coat of either matt or gloss varnish. Remember however never to varnish over metal finish paints as this may cause the metallic sheen to spread to other areas which you have carefully painted.



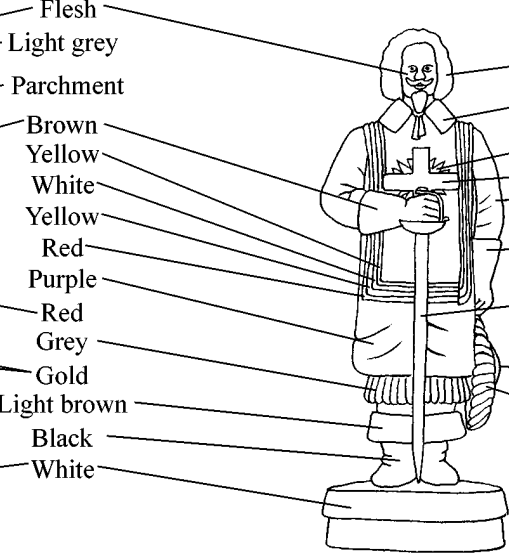

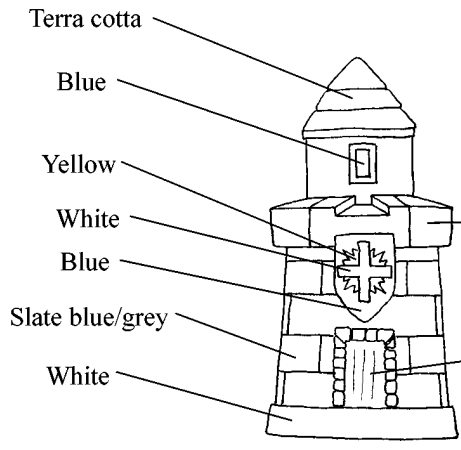

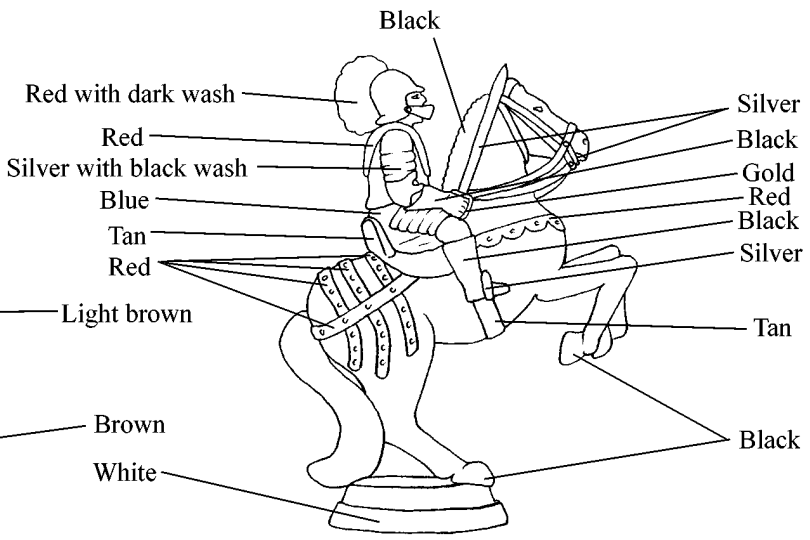

Not only is it possible for you to cast a chess set for yourself, you can also cast a valuable gift for your friends. The price of a well painted chess set can easily reach 1,000 in quality gift stores.

In addition to this mould set you will require a Prince August Accessory Kit 2000, Casting metal - (see chart on right), paints, super detail brushes, thinners, large flat file, small file, snips and a domestic heat source, preferably an electric hotplate.

Antiquing - Should you not wish to paint the pieces using different colours you can give them an antique finish.



FIG.1. Polish the pieces lightly with steel wool. Be careful not to rub off any fine detail.

FIG.2 & 3. Paint the pieces with gloss black enamel. Let the paint soak in for five minutes.

FIG.4. Wipe off the paint with a cloth dampened with thinners. Leave the black in the folds of the piece according to your taste, then let the paint dry in the usual way.

FIG.5. Leave for 12 hours and then gently polish them again with steel wool or wire brush. You can use the same method to create an opposing side by using paint of a different colour. Or painting a base colour such as gold and then antiquing them with black.
